Mobile Phones

A great many issues, including safeguarding concerns, can be created when children have access to mobile phones, therefore pupils are not allowed to have mobile phones, including smart watches, in school.

Jewellery

We want our children to be safe in all aspects of the school day, therefore we ask that jewellery is kept to a bare minimum: Stud earrings for pierced ears and/or a watch are permitted. For safety reasons, the children must be able to remove the earrings themselves before participating in PE or other physical activities. Necklaces, bracelets, rings, hoop or dangling earrings etc. are not allowed.

As children will not be permitted to participate in swimming, PE lessons or any physical after-school activities if they cannot remove their studs, it is advisable to have new ear piercings carried out at the beginning of the summer holidays.

Please note: The school is not responsible for the safe keeping of jewellery.

Hair Styles

It is lovely to see children with smart, practical hairstyles which do not distract them from their learning and play, therefore during term time, pupils must not have 'fashion hairstyles' which include shaved, dyed or streaked hair, patterns, Mohawks, lines and tramlines etc.

For safety reasons we ask that long or shoulder length hair is fastened back, for example using a headband, braid or ponytail.

Nails

In order that children can enjoy the day fully, nails need to be kept natural whilst at school. False nails, nail extensions, nail art etc. are not permitted.

Make-up

As children need to feel free from the pressures of growing up too quickly, pupils are not allowed to wear make-up in school.
